# PROJECTS

From the beginning, our heart at Seacoast has been to meet people right where they are, to be a life-giving presence in every community where God has called us. Today, each of our campuses has an impact on their communities, and we are committed to resourcing them to accomplish all that God has called Seacoast to do. That means addressing capacity and facility issues at the campuses that most need attention.

### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- We met our original matching gifts for the Johns Island (JI) Building
   Project in August, bringing our total funds raised to \$4,169,000.
- We received an additional 2-for-1 matching gift of \$400,000 from 2 families
  for the JI Building Project. Once those funds are matched, it will provide
  an additional \$1.2M toward the project.
- Charleston County has reviewed our JI proposal. We are preparing for a November meeting with the Board of Zoning Appeals.
- Our Cane Bay Campus launched on September 10th, with 816 in attendance.
- We purchased a tract of land adjacent to our Summerville Campus,
   which includes additional parking and a 6,000-square-foot building that will
   be used as a local missions hub and office space.
- We replaced lighting in the Mount Pleasant Student Center.
- The **Seacoast Podcast** has recorded 60 episodes, with 100,000 downloads in over 1,500 cities in the U.S. and in 50 countries.

## VISION PROJECT JOHNS ISLAND CAMPUS PERMANENT FACILITY

The Johns Island Campus serves the James Island, Johns Island, Folly, Kiawah, and Seabrook areas. Currently, the campus meets at the Charleston Collegiate School on Johns Island, requiring our teams to set up and tear down weekly and store supplies in containers located onsite, which has severely limited capacity to grow our church family. We believe 24/7 space is needed to effectively minister to those who call this campus home. Recently, we purchased land and are developing plans to build a facility to exponentially promote our ministry and outreach opportunities.

Pray for wisdom and discernment in developing building plans for a facility that allows us to continue our ministry to the surrounding communities.

**PROJECT ESTIMATED COST:** \$11.5 Million

**FUNDRAISING GOAL:** \$8 Million

## VISION PROJECT SUMMERVILLE MISSION BUILDING RENOVATION

Seacoast's Summerville Campus is bursting at the seams. Large corporations continue to open new facilities and branches in the local area, causing Summerville to become one of the fastest growing towns in South Carolina. Thanks to your generosity, we were able to purchase a tract of land adjacent to our Summerville Campus, which includes additional parking and a 6,000-square-foot building that will be used as a local missions hub and office space. Our focus will now be renovating the space for offices and our missions' activities, including the winter warming center, food pantry, car care ministry, shower ministry, senior food program, state prison ministry, and bicycle ministry.

Pray that God provides the necessary resources to help us renovate this space, so we can continue to make a difference in our community.

### **PROJECT ESTIMATED COST:**

Phase I: \$300,000, including renovation of offices and bathrooms

Overall Project: \$1 Million

## VISION PROJECT GREENVILLE CAMPUS PERMANENT FACILITY

The Greenville Campus launched in 2004 and has operated in 5 locations during the last 18 years. We currently meet in a private school facility and have limited access to the space except for Sunday morning services. Our volunteers set up the church every weekend and then tear it all down again. We cannot establish permanent signage and generally lack the visibility needed. The space is barely functional and does not reflect Seacoast Church's commitment to excellence. The auditorium is small, making response time challenging for all the people who call our campus "home."

Without a permanent space, we are unable to minister to the needs of the community consistently. In addition, our campus offices are located over a mile from our service space. We would like to house our offices at the same location as the church. The lack of permanent space communicates doubt about our commitment to the city. We want people to know that we are here to stay, and we will transform our city. We are looking for an existing facility to serve as our forever home; however, acquisition of property and construction will be considered.

Pray for an existing facility that provides permanent space to minister to those who call this campus home. Please pray for God's guidance to find the best location and sufficient funding for our Greenville home.

**PROJECT ESTIMATED COST:** Dependent on acquisition and construction costs.

## VISION PROJECT MANNING CAMPUS PERMANENT FACILITY

Through the generosity of the Manning Campus, we purchased a building for our future home. The current lease expires mid-2024. Our vision is for this 16,000-square-foot building to be our permanent home. Most of the space will be dedicated to church use, while some space can be leased to local businesses. We believe this facility will be a tremendous asset for the church and the town of Manning. The campus has already raised over \$200,000 toward the project through donations and the sale of some of our property in Clarendon County.

**PROJECT ESTIMATED COST:** \$2 Million (based on preliminary plans)

## VISION PROJECT SEACOAST MUSIC OPERATING COSTS

Seacoast Music's vision is to create a vibrant, artistic community where worship leaders, musicians, and their families can thrive, fostering creativity and producing God-inspired works. To achieve this mission, we are seeking increased investment in key areas. This includes a full-time digital "storyteller," strategic partnerships for distribution and label services, a dedicated management team, augmented audio and video production, expanded writing opportunities, and robust digital marketing. We believe that each element is crucial for Seacoast Music to fulfill its potential and effectively bless the Church while ensuring financial sustainability. We invite you to join us on this creative journey, knowing that, together, we can amplify our impact and nurture the next generation of artists.

Pray that God would align the right team of contributors, and that our songwriting would be anointed, spirit-filled, scripturally-based, and would speak both locally and globally.

PROJECT ESTIMATED COST: \$250,000

### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- This past summer, 1,622 children attended Kids Camp, and 740 gave their lives to Christ. We had 801 volunteers help make Kids Camp possible.
- At Custom Summer Camp, we had 1,288 students attend, with 110
  accepting Christ as their Savior. There were also 61 post-camp baptisms at
  the August One Night event. At camp, \$7,900 was raised for the students'
  Heart For mission project.
- This fall, 15 new students will attend **SEU Seacoast Campus**, bringing the current total to 34.
- In the Mount Pleasant Student Center, the house and theatrical lighting systems have been replaced.



# VISION PROJECT MOUNT PLEASANT CAMPUS CUSTOM MINISTRY SPACE RENOVATION

In 2019, our Custom Student Ministry transitioned into the former Worship Center. Although there is capacity to grow in the Student Center, updates and renovations continue to be needed. Phase 1 is underway, with painting, audio visual upgrades, outdoor space enhancements, and new seats. The house and theatrical lighting systems have also been replaced.

The three main environments of the Student Center include: relational space, physical space, and spiritual space. Relational space helps facilitate small groups and cultivate relationships, while physical space allows for recreation and play. Our vision features a double-decker basketball court as well as a new audio visual system.

Novus Architects has developed concepts for renovating the 12,000- square-foot Student Center. The team is developing the final design along with construction timeline.

Pray that we are able to design and fund an environment that maximizes relational, spiritual, and intellectual growth for our students.

**PROJECT ESTIMATED COST:** \$2 Million

# VISION PROJECT CUSTOM SUMMER CAMP & RETREATS SCHOLARSHIP FUND

At Summer Camp and student retreats, so many middle school and high school students' lives are changed. These events are our most important student ministry opportunities, and we never want the cost to be the reason students can't attend. Scholarships allow more students the chance to find God, grow their faith, and build lasting relationships in a fun environment.

Pray that we can make Summer Camp and other student retreats accessible to all students, so they have the opportunity to come to know God.

PROJECT ESTIMATED COST: \$200,000

# VISION PROJECT MOUNT PLEASANT CAMPUS ADDITIONAL SPACE FOR CHILDREN'S ENVIRONMENTS

Our children's environments have reached maximum capacity for weekend services and events. Our longterm plans include updating our existing spaces to be fun and exciting, creating additional space for our special needs ministry and expanding our nursery areas. We currently have approved plans and blueprints and are preparing appropriate timelines.

Pray for children to experience the love of Christ in these new classrooms. Pray also for the architects and engineers as they design state-of-the-art classrooms for our kids.

**PROJECT ESTIMATED COST:** \$2 Million



# VISION PROJECT SEU SEACOAST FUND FOR ANNUAL OPERATING COSTS/SEU SCHOLARSHIPS

SEU Seacoast Campus is a regional campus for Southeastern University (Lakeland, FL). Since its launch in 2017, SEU Seacoast Campus has had 106 students and 36 graduates. The campus offers 10 different undergraduate degree options, 5 masters degrees, and 3 development tracks. In addition to students earning their academic degrees, they serve in practicums all across Seacoast departments and campuses.

In 2020, SEU Seacoast moved all classrooms into the Mount Pleasant Campus facility. The operating costs of SEU Seacoast include staffing and student housing, along with programmatic essentials, such as practicum costs, student life events, recruiting events, and mission trips.

We also would like to provide scholarships for students wanting to attend our school. Due to Southeastern University's main campus being located in Lakeland, Florida, students cannot use the South Carolina scholarship money. Therefore, having Legacy scholarship money available for academically strong, or special-circumstance students, would be an incredible blessing for SEU Seacoast.

Pray that God will continue to give direction to the leadership of SEU Seacoast and Southeastern University, and that students will thrive academically and spiritually in their practicums. Pray that God will give us favor with the South Carolina Higher Education Commission for local SC students to be able to use SC state scholarship funds.

**OPERATING COST FOR SEU:** \$88,000 annually

**COST TO FUND 1 STUDENT DEGREE:** \$10,000 annually

Our desire is to equip the church to serve the homeless and vulnerable children and families by creating clear pathways for engagement and partnership.

### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Seacoast's Dream Center Clinics at our North Charleston and West Ashley Campuses have
  provided over 600 unique patients with care and have conducted over a 1,000 patient visits this year.
  We are excited about upcoming new partnerships focusing on neurology, mental health care, and the
  launching of our new vision ministry.
- The **Food Pantries** at our Summerville, West, and North Charleston Campuses served approximately 13,710 people struggling with food insecurity.
- Summerville, West Ashley, and Mount Pleasant Car Care Ministries provided free oil changes and
  minor car repairs for 241 individuals who needed a tangible demonstration of the love of Jesus in this
  challenging financial season.
- Seacoast's Annual SERVE DAY provided an exciting opportunity for thousands of Seacoasters
  to demonstrate the love of Jesus to our neighbors through simple, but intentional acts of kindness.
   Volunteers served with local community partners, in addition to creating their own serve projects.





- Over 320 people assembled 61,000 meal packets with **Feed the Hunger**. These meal packets will be shipped to our global partner in Sri Lanka, where inflation has been hovering around 25%.
- Funding for counseling scholarships was provided to **Life Resources**, a Christian mental health resource center, for Seacoast attendees who would otherwise be unable to access assistance.
- We are grateful to have provided **ACTS 4** assistance (benevolence) to people in the church who were struggling with possible eviction, challenges paying bills due to the changing economic landscape, medical hardships, or changing personal circumstances.
- Sponsorships were provided for Walk for Autism and Healing Farms' Rock and Roll to raise
  awareness and funds for special needs programs.
- Caregivers often face overwhelming financial, emotional, and physical stress so we were excited to provide scholarships for a retreat at Camp Saint Christopher through **Heart of a Caregiver**.
- Support was given to Asheville Buncombe Community Christian Ministry (ABCCM) and to Palmetto Project's Homeless to Hope Fund to address poverty, hunger, and homelessness.
- We hosted a **Poverty 101** class to equip people in the church to build life-transforming relationships with our homeless neighbors. The event was accompanied by a ministry fair to provide opportunities to serve.
- Books and uniforms were provided to Title One school, Frierson Elementary School on Wadmalaw Island.
- Funding and volunteers were provided to Horry County Habitat for Humanity's Faith
  Build. Habitat builds safe, affordable housing with and for people in their community. The annual
  Faith Build provides the opportunity to display God's love and engage with other churches in the
  community, and future Habitat homeowners.



- A donation was given to **Charleston Hope** for their Title 1 School Initiatives to increase access to mental and behavioral health programs.
- A gift was given to the Formation Project to provide direct services to survivors of human trafficking in Charleston, South Carolina. Funding was also given to I AM Voices to provide for monthly lunch-and-learns to raise awareness and to expand services.
- Support was given to Three Rivers Respite to serve South Carolina foster families by providing
  children's camps and respite opportunities. Three Rivers, as well as DSS and Connie Maxwell
  Children's Ministries are partners in our new Seacoast Lowcountry Foster Care Ministry.
- In partnership with Edovo and Seacoast Online, Seacoast Local Missions provided funding to
  make our weekly services accessible to approximately 125,000 people in 230 correctional facilities
  across the country for 3 years.
- A gift was given to the African American Settlement Community Historic Commission
   Inc. for their Snowden Historic School Project.
- Ongoing support is provided to Coastal Crisis Chaplaincy, Dream Center Clinics, East
   Cooper Community Outreach, and the Lowcountry Pregnancy Center for the work they
   do to assist people in crisis.

## VISION PROJECT LOCAL MISSIONS MINISTRY AT ALL CAMPUSES

Seacoast Local Missions partners with organizations and agencies to address needs within the community. We focus on education, health, homelessness, foster care, and safe environments. In addition, several campuses provide services to support the homeless, vulnerable children and families. These ministries include food assistance, car care ministries, an emergency foster care closet and Adopt-a-Block.

Pray for our community partners and their staff and volunteers to have unity, patience, and encouraging glimpses of the impact they are making. Pray that God would give them wisdom and discernment. Pray for peace as they navigate tough situations and conversations. Pray for open doors for Seacoast and even bigger impact for the Kingdom.

# VISION PROJECT FOSTER CARE AT SEACOAST'S MOUNT PLEASANT CAMPUS

There are approximately 250 foster children in Charleston County, and hundreds more in the cities surrounding our Seacoast Campuses. In response to the foster care crisis, Seacoast's Mount Pleasant Campus has launched a Foster Care Ministry in partnership with community partners, including Connie Maxwell Children's Ministries and DSS to serve some of the most vulnerable in the Lowcountry. Jesus went to extravagant lengths to move closer to us in our brokenness, and we have the opportunity to live out the Gospel by moving toward the brokenness of children in foster care. We believe the Church is called to care for the most vulnerable in our community. Please pray that foster parents and their children receive the support they need.

**PROJECT COST:** \$100,000

### VISION PROJECT SUMMERVILLE LOCAL MISSIONS BUILDING

Legacy funds have assisted with the purchase of a warehouse near the church. Our vision is to renovate a 6,000-square-foot area to support Seacoast's under-resourced neighbors. Ministries, such as our cold weather warming shelter, car care, food pantry, and benevolence will be moved to this new space. Significant renovations are needed, such as bathrooms, flooring, dry wall, electrical work, and plumbing.

Please pray for the Local Missions staff and for the church to be a light in the darkness and serve the needs of the community.

**PHASE I COST:** \$300,000

**OVERALL PROJECT COST:** \$1 Million

## VISION PROJECT ALL CAMPUS ACTS 4 FUND

### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Over 1,097 churches have been planted through the **Association of Related Churches** (ARC), with a launch-day attendance of 250,000+ and 10,000+ salvations. Over 600 church planters and pastors were equipped through ARC Launch training events; 7,700 connected relationally through events like the ARC and Gather Conferences, and global launches. Through ARC Churches, more than \$7 million was given to church planting last year.
- The Pastors Collective will have held more than 50 retreats this year at the Retreat at Church Creek and will have served 750 pastors and leaders. The "1,000 Pastors" Campaign has raised scholarships for 670 pastors. Additionally, a new digital community will launch on the platform, Circle, to foster ongoing relationships, share valuable resources, and host online events.
- The Barnabas Network has become a member ministry of the Pastors
   Collective and will serve more than 200 men in leadership this year. The
   Barnabas Lodge opened in the Poconos, PA, as a place of rest for pastors,
   leaders, and their families. This mountain home includes 5 bedrooms and
   accommodates 12 guests.
- Christ in Action conducted maintenance and repairs on disaster relief
  equipment and purchased a small box truck to collect furniture for families who
  have lost everything in natural disasters.
- More people are enslaved today than any other time in history. Ongoing support
  was given to Trafficking Hope and the A21 Campaign to help in their fight
  against human trafficking.

## VISION PROJECT CHURCH PLANTING THROUGH ARC

The Association of Related Churches (ARC) was co-founded by Greg Surratt to be an association of churches working with church planters and church leaders. To date, ARC has planted 1,097 local churches and has networks in Canada, China, Ireland, Holland, Australia, and South Africa. Over \$30 million a year is donated to missions through ARC churches.

As a part of Seacoast's commitment to church planting through ARC, we provide support, guidance, and resources to continue to launch life-giving churches. ARC is immersed in developing new best practices for online church, and is updating all church-planting curricula that will be used to train couples as church planters.

Pray for an increase in potential church planters. Pray for church planters and for their families. Pray for wisdom, discernment, and strength for the ARC team.

**PROJECT ESTIMATED COST:** \$232,000 annually

## VISION PROJECT DISASTER RELIEF

Each year, Seacoast deploys resources throughout the country and internationally to respond to natural disasters. In order to respond quickly and appropriately, Seacoast aims to maintain the disaster relief fund at \$100,000 year-round. This fund allows us to partner with disaster relief organizations to help meet immediate needs in devastated communities.

Pray for the development of a strategic partnership network to be utilized in times of disaster. Pray for the people impacted by the disasters. Pray for the safety of those serving and for then to be an example of God's love and the church in action.

**PROJECT COST:** \$100,000

# VISION PROJECT PASTORS COLLECTIVE/ RETREAT AT CHURCH CREEK

The Pastors Collective (PC) exists to help pastors avoid and recover from burnout by offering strategic events, challenging podcasts, and opportunities for important conversations. This is the crucial work of helping pastors *be* well so they can *build* well. In partnership with the Wesleyan Investment Foundation, The Retreat at Church Creek acquired 66 acres in Charleston and offers world-class fishing and 2.5 miles of trails and peaceful landscapes. The vision of PC is to serve 10,000 pastors within the next 5 years.

**PROJECT COST:** \$125 per month funds 1 pastor/year for operational costs

### **DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT**

A full-time Director of Development is needed to oversee fundraising and partnerships. First-year, seed funding would include salary, travel, and support costs.

PROJECT ESTIMATED COST: \$150,000

#### RETREAT AT CHURCH CREEK RENOVATIONS

The main house has served more than 1,200 pastors and leaders, but was built as a house rather than a venue. Its limitations impact the quality of our guests' experience. We are working with a design team and seeking permits to improve and increase bedrooms, install a commercial kitchen, add bathrooms, upgrade HVAC, and modernize the space.

PROJECT ESTIMATED COST: \$900,000

### **HIGHLIGHTS**

### BETHANY CHRISTIAN LIFE CENTER (BCLC), SRI LANKA

In a country where Christianity is 7.4%, BCLC celebrated their 22nd anniversary. Through our partnership, they have secured a new location that will seat 1,500. Services will be held in 3 languages. BCLC has provided furniture and computers to 3 under-resourced schools, supported a local cancer hospital and 20 new micro-businesses, and hosted 3 trainings for 240 pastors.

#### CROSS-CONNECTING NETWORK: PAKISTAN

Funding was provided to ARC Pakistan to host and facilitate leadership development conferences in Karachi and Lahore. Over 250 leaders from their best church-planting and network-building churches gathered to receive training, be united with common vision, form collaborative ministry strategies, and be further equipped to plant churches in their areas.

#### HELPING INDIA MISSIONS, INDIA

Additional classrooms were funded at the St. John English Medium School in Kalikapur. This is the first English medium school in the village. There are currently over 50 students—many, the first in their families to attend school.

### CASA DE ORACION FAMILIAR (FAMILY PRAYER CENTER), HONDURAS

Pastor Daniel Dyer, through Casa de Oracion and Prisoners of Hope, continues to serve in 5 national prisons. OCF has planted 9 churches and has feeding centers in over 100 communities. They feed approximately 9,500 children per day and 10 care points serve 950 children. Seacoast's medical team treated over 680 individuals in prisons and at care points. Seacoast continues to provide mission teams and support to OCF ministries.

### PIONEERS TOGO

Pioneers Togo has 26 indigenous missionaries serving in 123 villages. Our Greenville Campus sent a team to support the Pioneers team through a marriage conference/retreat. Funding was also provided for the ongoing support of the Pioneers team and for medical and funeral expenses for one of their core team leaders.

### FRANCIS + BENEDICT, TOGO

Francis and Benedict's desire is to break the cycle of poverty in the lives of their seamstresses and their children. Funding has been provided for 6 homes for seamstresses and their children to promote generational stability, safety, and improve self-esteem.



### GOOD NEWS PRISON MINISTRY

Good News jail and prison ministry reaches those others have forgotten. Good News chaplains serve in 22 US states, 1 U.S. territory, and 24 foreign countries, bringing the good news of Jesus Christ to inmates and their families, and facility staff. Support was provided to continue work in Kenya and to help launch a new prison ministry in Turkey.

### BREAD OF LIFE, KENYA

Bread of Life Mission exists to reach the unreached people groups of Kenya and South Sudan with the good news of Jesus by providing for tangible (food, water, and medical), educational, and spiritual needs. Funding has been provided to plant a new church in Kanyangapus and for ongoing support of the Missionary Training School and community clinic.

### UNCHARTED

UnCharted focuses on locations that are unreached, overlooked, and forgotten. Funding has been provided to empower their field partners to respond to crises in their neighborhoods by giving them resources needed to host food or medicine distributions.

## VISION PROJECT GLOBAL CHURCH PLANTING

### **PIONEERS, TOGO**

Seacoast has been in partnership with Pioneers Togo for nearly 20 years. Togo is one of the smallest, poorest, and most overlooked countries in Africa. Within a population of 7 million, 29% are Christian, while the predominate religions in the rural areas are Islam, Voodoo, and other indigenous beliefs. Pioneers has planted 154 churches/Discovery groups among 13 people groups and is working in 84 rural villages. Pioneers Togo also broadcasts a weekly radio program that provides messages of salvation and hope. Their goal is to plant 15 new village churches and secure pastor support.

**PROJECT COST:** \$2,700 per church=\$40,500

PASTOR SUPPORT: \$23,040 annually

TOTAL - \$63,540

### CASA DE ORACION (FAMILY PRAYER CENTER), HONDURAS

In Honduras, Pastor Daniel Dyer leads the multi-site church network, Casa de Oracion Familiar (OCF), and serves as National Director for Children's Cup ministry. His OCF churches operate feeding centers and conduct prison ministry throughout the country to reach Honduras for Christ. Over 60% of the population lives in poverty in rural areas, and approximately 1 out of 5 Hondurans earn less than \$1.90 per day. OCF intends to plant 50 churches and discipleship training centers throughout the country.

PROJECT COST: \$5,000 per church

TOTAL - \$250,000: Funds 50 churches/centers

### BETHANY CHRISTIAN LIFE CENTER, SRI LANKA

Sri Lanka is approximately 7.4% Christian, with the majority of the population, Buddhist. Bethany Church and Pastor Dishan are committed to church-planting efforts to reach Sri Lanka for Christ. Due to the current economic crisis, funds are needed to support basic necessities for over 150 pastors.

**PROJECT COST:** \$25,000

Pray that the local church would expand its influence around the world, and that the needed resources would be supplied.



## VISION PROJECT GLOBAL LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

### CASA DE ORACION (FAMILY PRAYER CENTER), HONDURAS

Casa de Oracion has been working in prisons in Honduras since 2001 as Prisoners of Hope Ministries. They are ministering in 5 prisons and are impacting over 4,000 inmates, in addition to police officers and prison personnel through training, discipleship, and special events. Nearly half of the Family Prayer Team are former prisoners whom God is now using to train and save others.

**PROJECT COST:** \$30,000 funds the prison ministry for 1 year

### **ONE HOPE & BIBLICA**

One Hope is working with Biblica Bible translators to eradicate Bible poverty in this generation. Over a billion people worldwide lack access to complete Bibles in their language. Translations are needed for 3,641 languages. Together, we hope to make God's Word accessible to all people by 2033.

No scripture translation currently exists in the Contemporary Eastern Punjabi dialect spoken in India and Pakistan. More than 48 million people speak this dialect and 68% live below the poverty line.

This project would foster church growth in these communities and scripture-engagement programs through One Hope's Durable Network.

**PROJECT COST:** \$1 Million (\$200,000 annually for 5 years) Funds provide the translation of the Bible to Contemporary Punjabi and One Hope's Bible resources.

### ARC PAKISTAN, PAKISTAN

#### CONFERENCE SPONSORSHIP

In February 2024, 700 leaders from 350 churches will be invited to the ARC Pakistan National Conference. This gathering will help grow the ARC family, build friendships, empower and add value to leaders, and identify and encourage new church planters.

**PROJECT COST:** \$98,613

#### LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT FOR 2023-2024

**Project 1:** From August 2023 through July 2024, ARC Pakistan will facilitate leadership training events across the country for 2,000 pastors and leaders from over 600 churches.

**PROJECT COST:** \$64,996

**Project 2:** From August 2023 through July 2024, ARC Pakistan will coordinate coaching and mentoring programs for over 4,300 pastors and leaders. This is a strategic combination of post-training follow-up networks, ARC Prayer Gatherings, and ARC Hangouts.

**PROJECT COST:** \$30,789

### **BREAD OF LIFE (BOL), KENYA**

MISSIONARY TRAINING SCHOOL: BOL seeks support to cover school expenses and housing at the BOL Missionary Training School for 19 students. BOL also intends to hold a Missions Conference in multiple regions to share the vision for spreading the Gospel.

**PROJECT COST:** \$30,000

Pray for more pastors and leaders to teach and mentor future church leaders in areas hostile toward the Gospel. Pray that inmates' hearts will be softened, and they will be discipled and redeemed. Also, pray for the inmates' families.



## VISION PROJECT GLOBAL SOCIAL IMPACT

### **PIONEERS, TOGO**

Nearly 81.2% of Togo's rural population lives below the global poverty line. Over half live on \$1/day. It is estimated that 40% do not have access to a clean water source. One out of eight Togolese children will not live to see their fifth birthday. This is due, primarily, to waterborne diseases and a lack of medical care.

**PROJECT COST:** \$6,700 each for 15 wells in rural villages

• TRANSPORTATION FOR PASTORS: Many pastors serve in multiple villages over 10 miles apart. We would like to purchase 14 motorcycles to allow pastors to increase their capacity to share the Gospel.

**PROJECT COST:** \$16,800

• **MISSIONARY HOUSING:** With home ownership out of reach for most missionaries and pastors, we are seeking to provide basic housing for 5 missionaries.

**PROJECT COST:** \$50,000 (5 homes)

### BETHANY CHRISTIAN LIFE CENTER, SRI LANKA

The current economic crisis, and Sri Lanka defaulting on international loans, has had severe humanitarian consequences for many vulnerable people. Sri Lanka faces rampant fuel and food shortages. Bethany is committed to being the hands and feet of Jesus by serving those in need.

• PASTORS EDUCATION FUND: Bethany is committed to church planting and reaching the nation for Christ, but many pastors do not have the resources to provide basis needs to their families. This fund will assist with the education of pastors' children.

PROJECT COST: \$4,500

• WIDOWS MINISTY: Bethany intends to provide medicine and food parcels for over 100 widows at \$36 per month.

**PROJECT COST:** \$3,600

• **TRANSPORTATION FUND:** We would like to provide a transportation fund for church planters and key leaders to attend weekly meetings.

**PROJECT COST:** \$10,000



### **WATER MISSION**

Over 2.2 billion people lack access to safe water—one-third of the world's population. Water Mission has provided more than 7,000,000 people in 57 countries with lasting safe water solutions. Your generous gift builds safe water solutions for individuals and communities around the world.

**PROJECT COST:** \$50,000 (annual support for disaster relief efforts)

### ONE WORLD HEALTH

One World Health's vision is to see impoverished communities take ownership in a sustainable healthcare model, so that they become empowered to bring about long-term change and tangible improvements in health and quality of life. They have developed a model that provides affordable healthcare to the communities who need it most and does not require ongoing support to keep the doors open.

Since their founding in 2009, One World Health has seen 700,000 patients. They currently employ 175 local medical staff as part of their model to promote sustainability. We strive to contribute funding for operations and new clinics in Nicaragua, Uganda, and Honduras.

**PROJECT COST:** \$50,000 (annual support for new clinics)

### FRANCIS + BENEDICT, TOGO

**HOUSING PROJECT:** Francis + Benedict (F+B) empowers and equips skilled Togolese seamstresses by providing them with dignified and sustainable employment. Their profits are used to resource community leaders in Togo, enabling them to continue projects that benefit orphans, widows, and those suffering in poverty. Francis + Benedict's desire is to break the cycle of poverty in the lives of their seamstresses and their children. Home ownership is typically out of reach. The provision of appropriate housing provides generational stability, safety, and improves self-esteem. The goal is to purchase land and provide 7 homes to seamstresses and their children.

**PROJECT COST:** \$85,000 (for land and remaining homes)

### **ARC PAKISTAN, PAKISTAN**

#### **EDUCATIONAL NEEDS FOR PAKISTAN 2023–2024**

 Karachi School – Provide funding to rebuild the school that was severely damaged by flooding, and simultaneously expand the building size to accommodate 750 students (up from 450 capacity) to impact more families in the community.

**PROJECT COST:** \$270,000

 Kotri School – Complete construction at the Kotri School by providing a solar power system and lighting to improve building use for students and the surrounding community.

**PROJECT COST:** \$21,000

- Layyah School Provide the remaining operating costs to support the current 150 students. PROJECT COST: \$20,000
- **School in Lahore** Provide the remaining operating costs to support the current 102 students. **PROJECT COST:** \$10,000
- **School in Karachi** Provide the remaining operating costs to support the current 135 students. **PROJECT COST:** \$15,000
- School in Kotri Provide the remaining operating costs to support the current 292 students. PROJECT COST: \$27,000

Pray for the needs of those living in poverty. Read Matthew 25:34-40 and be mindful that God has called us to have compassion and care for the under-resourced. Pray that the provision of education, clean water, health care and other basic needs will be used to share God's love. Pray that God opens doors for economic opportunities for those in need of employment, allowing them to provide for their families and others.
